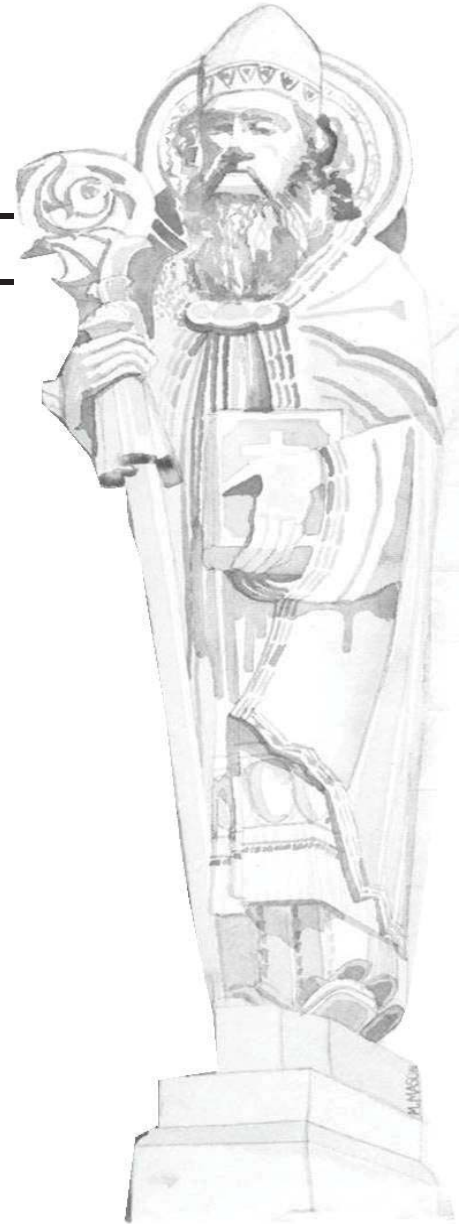

HOLYDAYS OF OBLIGATION

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. (3rd commandment)
Catholics observe Sundays and Holydays of Obligation by participating in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

You shall observe the Holydays of Obligation, (4th precept of the Church)

This precept reminds all Catholics to participate in the Eucharist on the principal feasts which honor the mysteries of the Lord, the Virgin Mary and the saints. In the United States, the Holy days of Obligation are:

Solemnity of Mary, January 1st

Ascension Thursday (forty days after Easter)

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, August 15th

Solemnity of All Saints, November 1st

Immaculate Conception, December 8th

Christmas, December 25th

On Sundays and other Holydays of Obligation the faithful are bound to participate in Mass. (Code of Canon Law, c. 1247)

This obligation should not be taken lightly. Extra opportunities to fulfill this obligation are offered to accommodate all schedules.
