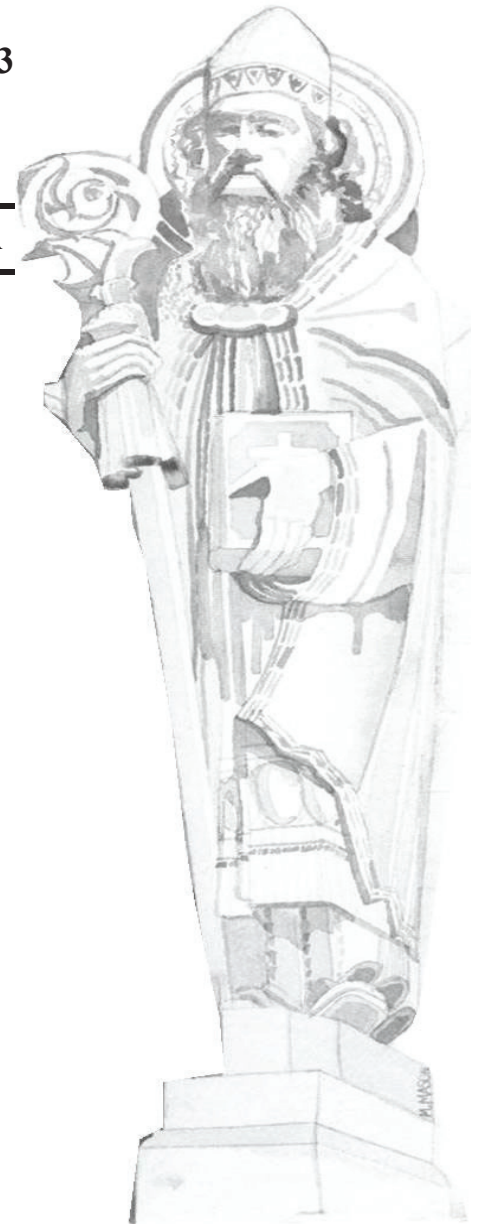

**FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**


*Liturgical Capsules that are Not Hard to Swallow  
Reverence in Our Celebration of the Eucharist*

*Silence is not only Golden but Sacred ~ Worship is the reverence and honor we offer God for being who He is and for what He has done for us. When we worship God, we use words, actions and gestures to express our love and devotion. This is especially true when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, which is our greatest act of public worship. Our reverence and behavior should reflect the importance of each celebration. In order to set a prayerful atmosphere, or silent preparation is essential. Quiet time is important to allow each individual to mentally prepare for the celebration. Therefore, it is our responsibility to maintain respectful silence once we enter the doors of the church. Complete cooperation is required. If important conversation is necessary, individuals should move outside the main body of the church to the entrance area. Let us attempt to observe this practice for our celebration.*

**Thoughts to Reflect on and Share:** *“The Father trusted His Son with the responsibility of shepherding women and men of ‘every nation, race, people and tongue’. Jesus, trusting in the same way, passed that same responsibility to each of us to be welcoming to all people. What do we do to live up to that trust and awesome responsibility? The 10 Commandments form the ethical core of this covenant while the instructions for building a tent of worship accentuate God’s intention to dwell in the midst of the people. **East Catholic School's 32nd Annual Shakespeare Play**

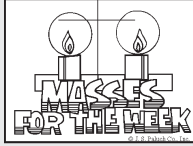
