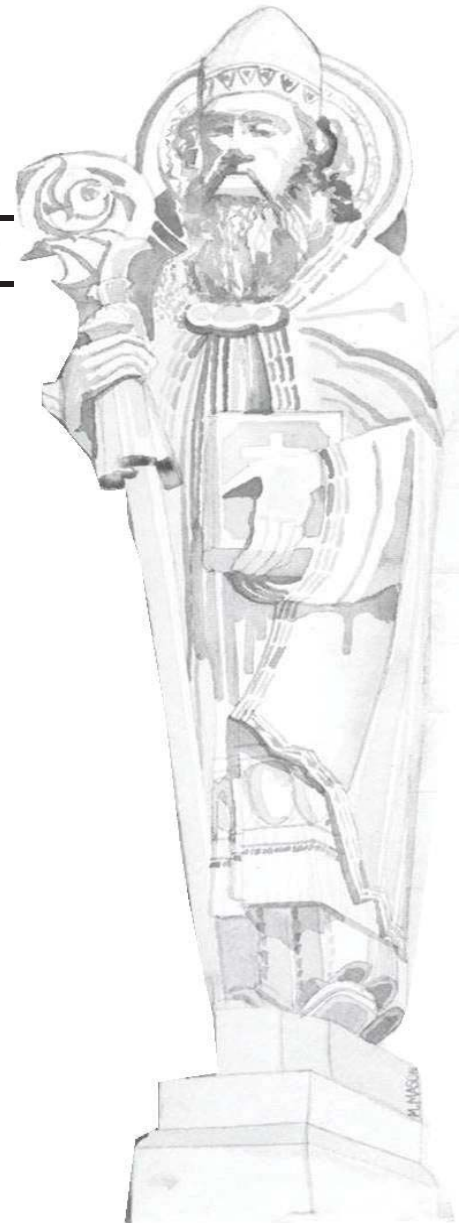

**SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY
BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

Today's feast reminds us of three transformations. The first is the mysterious changing of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We as a community become united as nothing else could ever unite us. We are brought together in a union by the Lord himself. We become the Body of Christ. The third transformation happens through our union with Christ and with one another; we are sent to transform the world. We bring the transforming power of God's love to all those in need of such a wonderful gift.
