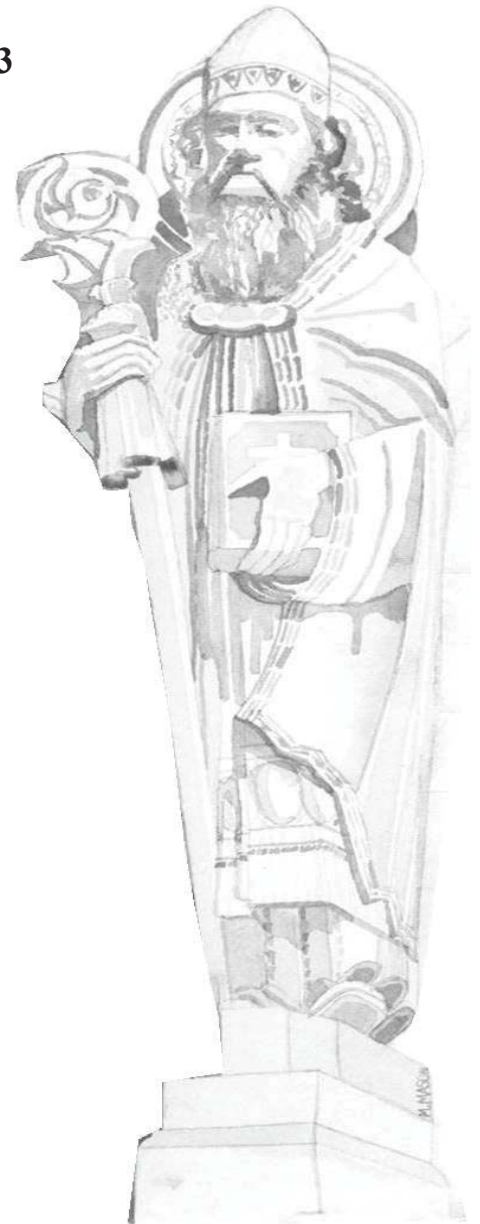

THE FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's gospel lesson, Mark tells us that "Jesus summoned the twelve and began sending them out two by two." It is very early in Jesus' public ministry but already He is sending out His followers to preach and teach and heal and witness to the Good News of a loving God who cares about His human creation. Every Christian is commissioned to a ministry of love and justice in the name of Jesus Christ. Whatever your vocation - - salesperson, lawyer, clerk, doctor, homemaker, musician, whatever - you are at the same time a fulltime minister of Jesus Christ out in the world. We do not come to church merely to have our needs met. Genuine discipleship involves more than getting what we can for ourselves. We are called to a ministry of loving service. No matter what neighborhood we live in, while we're there we are the Lord's ministers - full time.
