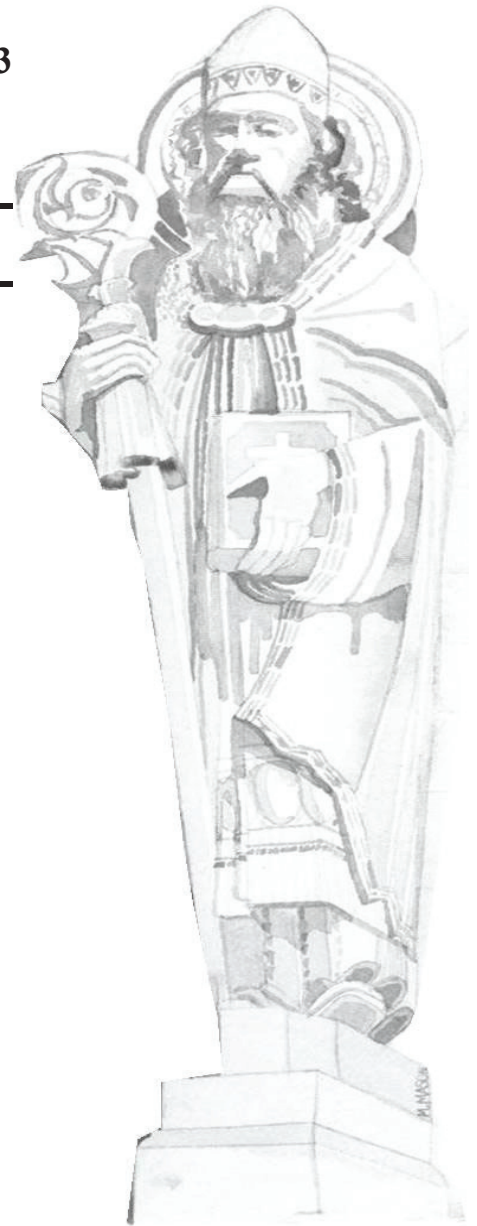

**FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME**

In today's gospel lesson, Mark tells us that "Jesus summoned the twelve and began sending them out two by two." Every Christian is commissioned to a ministry of love and justice in the name of Jesus Christ. Whatever your vocation - salesperson, lawyer, clerk, doctor. Homemaker, musician, whatever - you are at the same time a full time minister of Jesus Christ out in the world. We do not come to church merely to have our needs met. Genuine discipleship involves more than getting what we can for ourselves. We are called to a ministry of loving service. No matter where we are, no matter what our vocation, no matter what neighborhood we live in, while we're there we are the Lord's ministers - full time.

He flew over 400 combat missions in Vietnam and was awarded two Silver Stars and two Distinguished Flying Crosses. As a result of being shot down over North Vietnam, he was captured and spent five years as a POW in six different POW camps, twice kept in the famous Hanoi Hilton. **MEET THE NEW CLERGY TEAM**

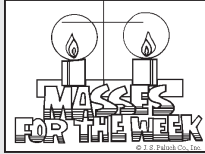
