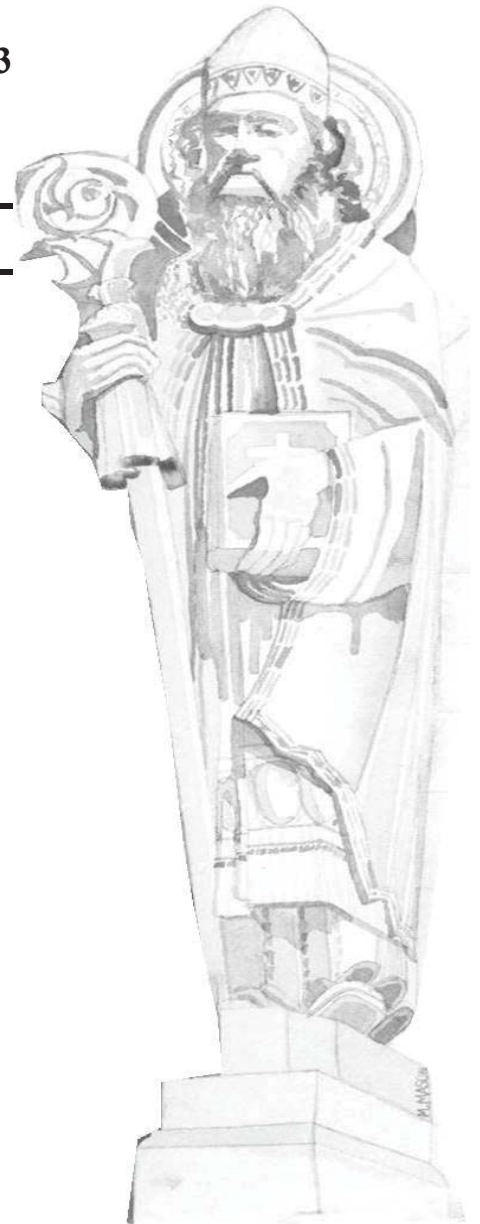

THE TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The teaching of God's word today is not easy to accept at face value. It makes bold claims regarding discipleship. Many would find great difficulty in surrendering our positions or leaving our family behind in the interests of following Christ. We breathe a bit more easily because the ultimatum has never been set before us. While we remain faithful church-goers, our personal lives remain largely undisturbed. Today's liturgy gives us an occasion to pause and think. We are even advised to weigh well the cost of discipleship. To take it seriously is to walk a rocky road. But we should take courage. We are not asked to change radically. Jesus asks for a change of mindset. We can be less consumerist, more simple in our tastes, find more room for others, more time to serve the less fortunate. The doors of our home and our heart begin to open more. The psalm reminds us that we have a relatively short span of life. Our task is bringing Christianity to life.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: "Now is not a time for hatred, name-calling, prejudice and discrimination, but a time for love and compassion. For Christ Himself tells us, 'when they persecute you in one town, flee to another', and, 'Do what is right and just. Rescue the victim from the hand of his oppressor. Do not wrong or oppress the resident alien, the orphan or the widow, and do not shed innocent blood in this place'. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

St. Colman Religious Education Program begins in September on Tuesday evenings from 6-7:30pm for grades K-8. **Please Note:** It is a Diocesan Policy for all students to receive a **minimum of 2 full years** of education before the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist (grades 1 and 2) and **8 full years** before Confirmation. If your child does not attend a Catholic School, make sure they are registered. If you are a member of another parish, permission from your pastor is required to attend St. Colman. Registration has begun. Forms have been sent out, please return them to the rectory with your registration fee. If you did not receive the forms call the rectory office at 412-823-2564 and they will be mailed to you. This year we are opening our Kindergarten class to 4 & 5 year olds. 4 year olds must be 4 before September 1st.

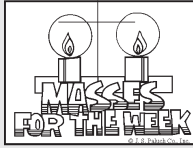
