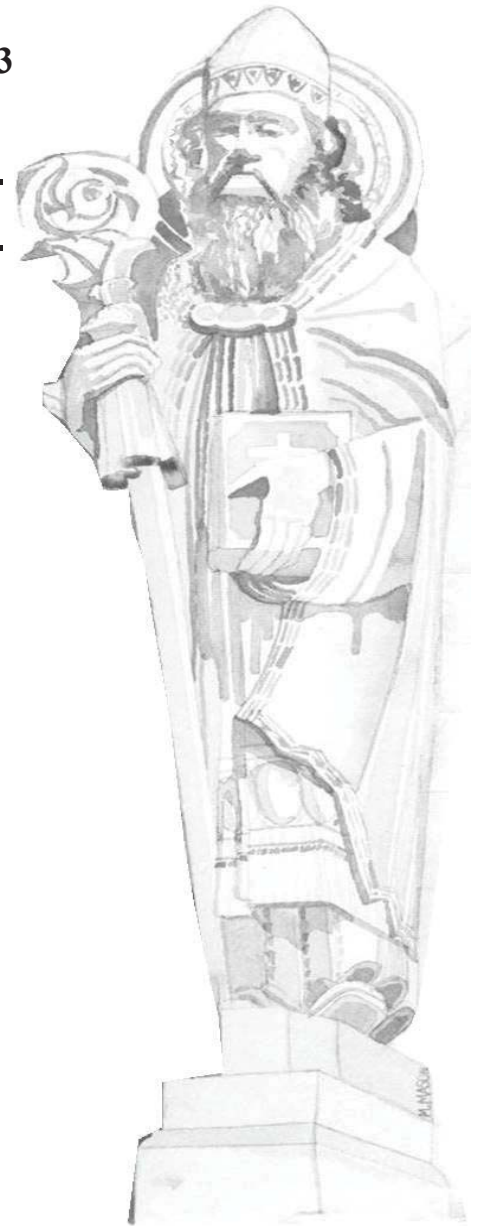

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

It is fascinating to try to figure out when the end of the world will come. This Sunday’s reading from the Gospel might seem to foster such curiosity. Modern scripture scholars tell us that such was not Jesus’ purpose in speaking about the “roaring of the seas” and the “heavens shaken.” In fact, Jesus Himself tells us that “no one knows...the exact day or hour,” not the angels, not even Himself. A prayerful study of the Scriptures leads to a less exciting but far more important conclusion. Jesus spoke of the end of the world, of His Second Coming, in order to inspire us with the *urgency of the gospel message*. The time to believe is NOW. The time to love all our brothers and sisters, to bring justice to the world, to live unselfishly is NOW. The end could come at any moment. Jesus encourages us to live in the present as though the end was just around the corner. There is no time to waste. Live the gospel message vigorously. In the end, buildings, possessions, power or prestige will not matter. The Father will ask “did you love me and show that love in service and concern for my people?” First and foremost we are the one Body of Christ, united in the Eucharist. That should be our primary concern.
